






HOME MAINTENANCE AMONG HOMEOWNERS AGE 50+

The Hartford Center for Mature Market Excellence[®] and the MIT AgeLab conducted research to understand the home maintenance experience of homeowners 50+. Through qualitative and quantitative methods, the study looked at whether homeowners had home maintenance tasks that were yet to be done and why.








Managing Home Maintenance

Home maintenance becomes harder as homeowners age.



Home Damage

Water leaks topped the list of home damage experienced by homeowners 50+, yet only 16% of homeowners 50+ surveyed think the consequences of a water leak would be extremely serious.

Home Damage Experienced

- 27% Water leak from roof
- **21%** Water leak from hot water heater or pipes in home
- 17% Weather or natural events
- 11% Insect, rodent or pest damage



16% of homeowners 50+ think the consequences of a water leak would be extremely serious

59% of homeowners 50+ think the consequences of a home fire would be extremely serious

According to an analysis of claims data from the AARP® Homeowners Insurance Program from The Hartford, water damage from plumbing, heating and air conditioning is the most common cause for a homeowners insurance claim.*

Smart Home Technology

Smart water and/or mold monitoring sensors and smart water shut off valves topped the list of smart home technologies that homeowners 50+ said would help with home maintenance, but few owned them.

The Hartford and the MIT AgeLab conducted focus groups with sixty homeowners age 50+ in Phoenix, Arizona, and Boston, Massachusetts, during June 2017. The MIT AgeLab also fielded a consumer survey with 1,022 homeowners age 50+ between September 11 and 18, 2017, using Qualtrics. Using a 95 percent level of confidence, the margin of error is +/- 5 percent. Additionally, nine homeowners over the age of 50 were interviewed in September and October 2017.
