FDA APPROVES VACCINE(S)

Refrigerated vaccine doses (2°C to 8°C) and/or frozen (-20°C) shipped in bulk to centralized distribution centers; adjuvant also sent when required by vaccine manufacturer



RECEIVE MEDICAL SUPPLIES

Various product suppliers and the U.S. government send McKesson the supplies needed to administer the vaccines, which include:

- Alcohol prep pads
- Face shields
- Surgical masks
- · Needles & syringes
- Diluent for vaccines *that* require reconstitution only



MCKESSON CREATES SUPPLY KITS

Pick supplies to create each kit

Pack supplies into one box, including vaccination record cards and vaccine administration sheet

Ship to McKesson vaccine distribution centers; for ultra-frozen vaccine kits send directly to delivery partners

*McKesson is not distributing the Pfizer vaccine



MCKESSON OPERATES AS A CENTRALIZED DISTRIBUTOR

Receive supply kits and the vaccines; maintain the appropriate temperature for all doses

Intake order from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, which details what to ship, where to ship, how much to ship and when to ship

Pick supply kits and vaccine doses (minimum of 100 doses per order)

Pack vaccines in special containers for refrigeration or frozen needs

Ship vaccines and the appropriate number of supply kits via delivery partners
