About the Grant Partners

UnitedHealth Group, including the United Health Foundation and UnitedHealthcare, is donating a total of \$4.5 million to increase access to health care, improve health outcomes and support communities across Oklahoma. The collective investments will meet urgent health needs across the state by focusing on the biggest areas of opportunity to address health disparities.

The seven community organizations that have been awarded grants are:

Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma

Community Food Bank of Eastern Oklahoma feeds the hungry of Eastern Oklahoma through a network of partner agencies to engage communities in ending hunger. With branches in Tulsa and McAlester, the Food Bank distributes donated items to hundreds of partner agencies operating feeding programs in 24 counties. These programs include emergency food pantries, soup kitchens, emergency shelters, child feeding programs, senior feeding programs and veteran's initiatives. \$140,000 was provided to expand the food bank's campus and school-based pantry program to 10 additional schools and colleges in rural, underserved communities so that food insecure students and their families will have regular access to healthy food.

Health Alliance for the Uninsured

Health Alliance for the Uninsured (HAU) is a catalyst for access to health care services for those who otherwise would be unable to obtain them. HAU is a community collaborative that makes quality health care available to Oklahoma county's vulnerable uninsured and under-insured populations. Partners include physicians, safety net clinics, hospitals and other public and private partners. \$1.8 million was granted to integrate new behavioral health assessments, monitoring, interventions and staff training that are designed to improve health outcomes for uninsured and underinsured individuals with diabetes at 20 free/charitable clinics across the state.

From Senior Centers for active adults age 50 and older, to Case Management and Adult Day Health for older adults struggling to maintain their independence, LIFE is committed to helping seniors of all ages and circumstances. \$200,000 was provided to fund the organization's "Active Senior Center" programs that include virtual and in-person fitness and nutrition classes and a variety of social activities such as walking groups.

Meals on Wheels OKC delivers nutritious, hot meals to seniors through Meals on Wheels Oklahoma City and youth through its commUNITY Table program. Through its partnership with the Areawide Aging Agency, Meals on Wheels Oklahoma City works with churches and community organizations in Oklahoma County to deliver hot meals to homebound senior adults. \$110,000 was provided to make daily meals available to homebound older adults who are experiencing food insecurity and social isolation, and support the purchase of food-storage refrigeration.

Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma distributes food and other products through a network of nearly 1,300 charitable feeding programs, including community-based partner agencies, schools and community organizations. The Regional Food Bank is also a leader in educating the public on hunger, advocating for those living with hunger and providing access to additional resources. \$180,000 was provided to expand the "Healthy Living Pantry Box" program at 10 hospitals and clinics, which provides a box of healthy food to discharging patients who are identified as food insecure.
