March 11 marked the 10th anniversary of the Great East Japan Earthquake, The Reconstruction Agency will hold two online tours; a tour of Iwate & Miyagi prefectures, as well as a tour of Fukushima Prefecture, to promote understanding of the current state of reconstruction in the three disaster-affected prefectures.

The main theme of the Fukushima tour is agricultural recovery from damage caused by the Tokyo Electric Power Company Holdings Inc. Fukushima Daiichi Nuclear Power Stationdisaster. Participants will also have the opportunity to interact with people living in the disaster-affected areas, as well as receive food and beverage samples.
