

## Introducing the Robert A. Winn Career Development Award Scholars

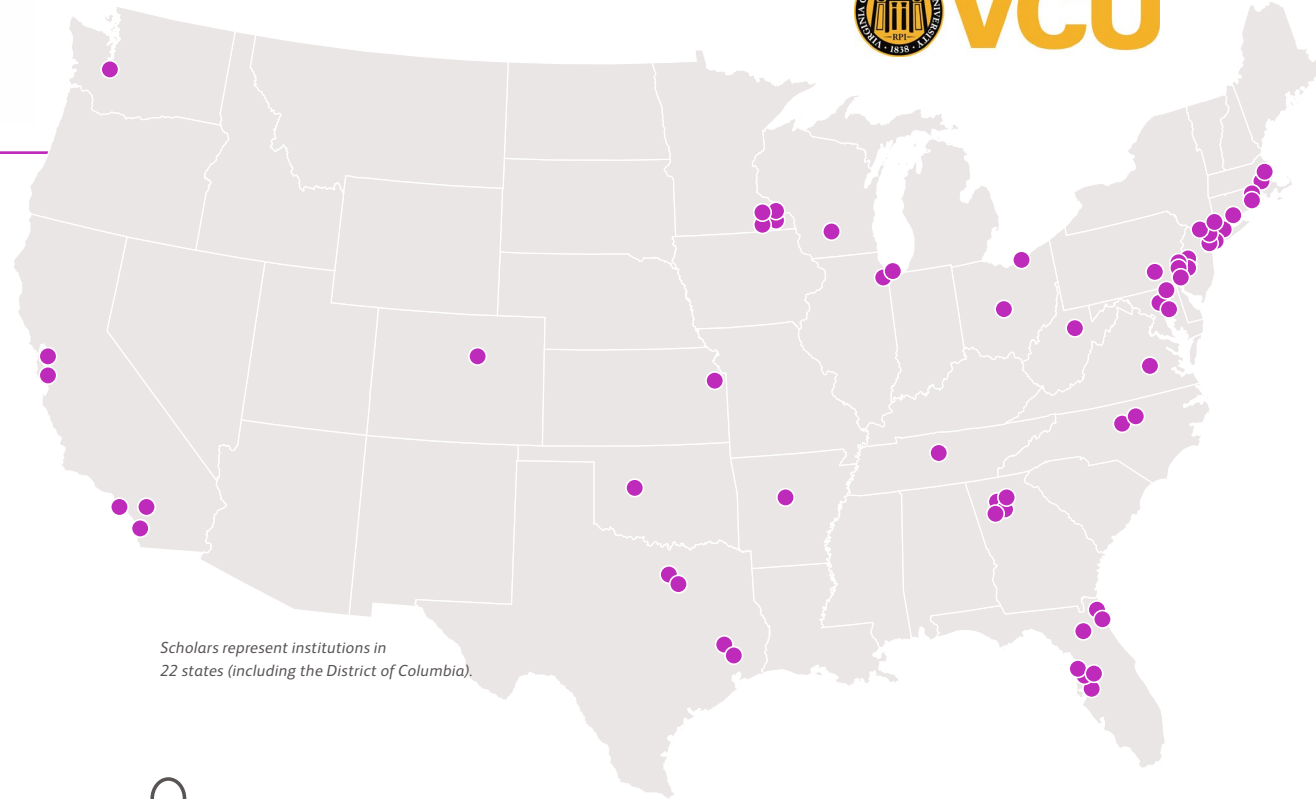

The 64 early-stage investigators are the second group to be trained through the two-year program, which aims to train more than 290 community-oriented clinical trialists by 2027.

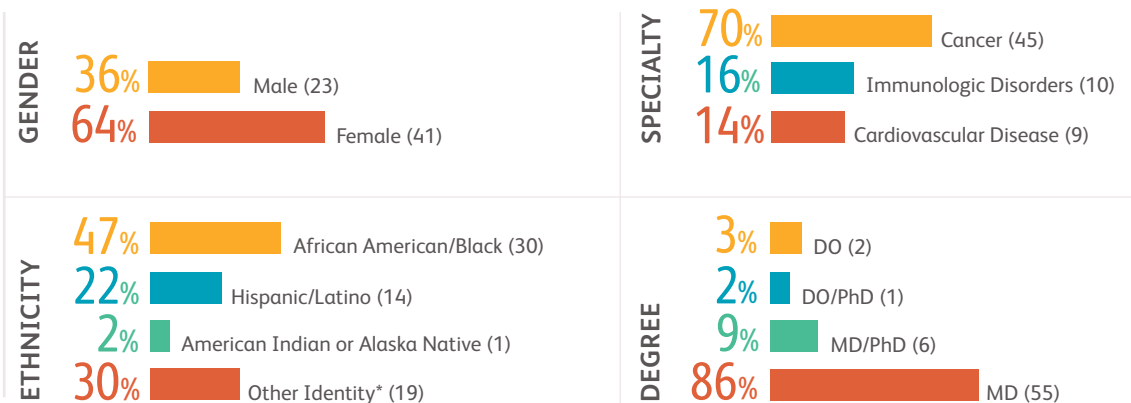
